Grant Program for Spouses of Deployed Airmen & Guardians



To support proactive vehicle care and help maintain safe, reliable transportation – while reducing the risk of costly emergency repairs – **AFAS offers spouses of currently deployed Airmen and Guardians \$200** to help with preventative vehicle maintenance.

This is a one-time payment per deployment.

Who Can Apply

Spouses of currently deployed Airmen and Guardians who meet the following criteria:

- ★ Active Duty (*All Ranks*)
- ★ Title 10/32 Guard/Reserve (*All Ranks*)

NOTE: When applying, the spouse must be listed as the **Applicant** and the service member as the **Member**.

Program Details

- ★ **Eligible Services:** Routine vehicle maintenance (*Includes oil changes, alignments, tire rotation, battery and windshield wiper replacement*)
- ★ **Type of Assistance:** Grant (*no repayment required*)
- ★ **Amount:** \$200 (*one-time payment per deployment*)
- ★ **Payment Method:** Direct deposit via Zelle or ACH

Documents Required

- ★ **Valid Dependent Military ID** (*copy of front and back*)
Expired dependent Military ID will not be accepted.
- ★ **Contingency Exercise Deployment (CED) Orders** (*copy of front and back, showing deployment for 15 days or more*)
- ★ **Leave and Earnings Statement** (*End of month LES*)



How to Apply

1. Visit afas.org and select **“Request Assistance”**
2. Log into the Application Portal (*or create an account*)
3. Click on **“Assistance”** to begin your application
4. Select **“Vehicle Expenses”**, then **“Road Ready Grant”**
5. Complete the application and upload all required documents

DEPLOYMENT & REMOTE ASSIGNMENT Child Care (DCC)



FAMILY CHILD CARE

— DEPARTMENT OF THE AIR FORCE —

SUPPORTING MILITARY FAMILIES, EVERY STEP OF THE WAY.

DCC childcare supports families whose sponsor is deployed in support of a contingency operation or on a remote assignment.

DEPLOYMENT CARE



16 hours of care per child per month (pre, during, and post deployment).

REMOTE ASSIGNMENT CARE



16 hours of care per child per month during remote assignment.

ELIGIBILITY



- ♥ Active Duty and Guard or Reserve Members (on active duty).
 - Guard or Reserve Members must be performing full time active duty in military status.
- ♥ Assigned to, living or working on the installation.
- ♥ No other adult in the household is available to provide care.
- ♥ Deployment Criteria: Minimum 30 day contingency operation deployment or short term deployments totaling 30 days in 6 months, deployed in place is not eligible.
- ♥ Remote Assignment Criteria: Unaccompanied PCS to a designated remote assignment.

HOW TO REQUEST CARE



- ✓ Sponsors submit DAF FCC ECC form with specific dates/times needed; supervisor signature is not required.
- ✓ Complete enrollment paperwork with the DAF Certified FCC Provider.
- ✓ Provide complete, approved set of Deployment or Remote Assignment Orders.
- ✓ Submit the request to:

DEPLOYMENT SUPPORT

Domestic Abuse Victim Advocate (DAVA) - Offering compassionate, confidential support to domestic abuse survivors by guiding them through legal, emotional support and practical steps toward safety planning.

New Parent Support Program (NPSP) - Provides information, support & education to expecting and new military parents with children through the age of 4, using the home-visit model.

Family Advocacy Strength Based Therapy (FAST) - Short term goal oriented, couples and family therapy for military members and their families to build healthier relationships and address risk factors to prevent maltreatment occurrences.
